

**2005 PROPOSED RESOLUTION**

**KEY RESULT AREA: Public Policy**

**RESOLUTION NUMBER: 2005 – PP #1**

**SUBMITTED BY: Animal Health and Food Security Policy Committee**

**SUBJECT MATTER: Mandatory National Animal Identification System**

**MOTION: The National Pork Producers Council supports the establishment of a mandatory national animal identification system (NAIS) for all relevant animal species by 2008. The NAIS would allow the U.S. Department of Agriculture to trace the movements of an animal, or group of animals, to the herd of origin, within 48 hours, during an animal health emergency in order to protect the nation’s critical food and agriculture sector.**

**The NAIS should not unduly burden pork producers and should allow for the identification of groups of animals as well as individual animals.**

**The National Pork Producers Council urges the Congress to provide sufficient funding to support the development and implementation of the necessary infrastructure needed for the NAIS.**

**Further, the National Pork Producers Council urges the Congress to consider granting the Secretary of Agriculture additional authorities directed towards protecting pork producers’ data and information provided as part of the National Animal Identification System.**
